Twilight Saga

Twilight Saga is a series of four fantasy romance novels written by the American author Stephanie Meyer. Its main theme is about vampires <u>who</u> have superhuman strength and speed. The story of Twilight also narrates a period in the life of Isabella "Bella" Swan, a teenage girl who moves to Forks, Washington, and falls in love with a 104-year-old vampire named Edward Cullen.

Twilight is the first novel of this series <u>which</u> is told from Bella's point of view. The second novel is New Moon which marks the appearance of another main character Jacob Black, a werewolf. *Eclipse* is the third of the four of Twilight books. The fourth of the Twilight books is *Breaking Dawn* which is divided into three parts in which Bella Swan becomes a vampire.

Since the release of the first novel, Twilight, in 2005, the books have gained immense popularity and commercial success around the world. The series is most popular among young adults; the four books have won multiple awards.

On March 2010, the series has sold over 100 million copies worldwide with translations into at least 38 different languages around the globe. The four Twilight books have consecutively set records as the biggest selling novels of 2008 on the USA Today Best-Selling books.
